MONTECITO SCHOOL

"The Little Forest" SUMMER DAY CAMP

June 29-August 21, 1964

The camp program, for children from 3 through 7 years of age, is under the direction of Mrs. Betty Williams, formerly Director of Peninsula School Summer Camp, Menlo Park and Mr. James F. Matthews, founder of MONTECITO SCHOOL. It will be a relaxed but stimulating program, designed to enrich the child's intellectual, physical, social, and emotional development.

In addition to day camp, several overnight camp-outs are planned.

FACILITIES

The setting is an acre of dense oaks, pines, and wild growth - almost like being in the Sierras. The facilities include picnic and camping grounds, swimming pool, two separate playgrounds fully equipped with sturdy equipment, excursion areas, vacant lot for group games, asphalt vehicle riding circle, crafts, painting, and carpentry building, two separate indoor class facilities, and kitchen.

PRESCHOOL AND PRIMARY CLASSES

Preschool class will include 3, 4, and young 5 year olds. Advanced 5's, 6's and 7's will be in the primary class. Each class will have separate classrooms, playground, picnic woods, equipment and teachers.

SC HED ULE

9:00 A.M., Morning classes begin by participation in various projects: painting, arts, crafts, carpentry, mechanical and block building, and science experiences. Vigorous playground activities are refreshing: climbing, trees and jungle gym, riding vehicles, digging, swinging and sliding. Stimulating dramatic activities take place in the doll corner and playhouse, and sand box.

Midmorning refreshments are enjoyed in the picnic woods, with popcorn and marshmallow cookouts around the open fire for special treats. Children rest during this time and share stories and music.

In the later morning, it's swim time, and plenty of vigorous play for those who don't like the water. If weather doesn't permit water play, we take a nature excursion or play group games.

Half-day children depart at 11:30. Or they may stay for picnic lunch if they wish, and depart at 12:30. Lunches are served camp style, around the open fire in the woods, and children enjoy roasting their own hot dogs, hamburgers, beans, biscuits on a stick, and marshmallows. Children who are staying for the day rest or nap on cots after lunch, and then join the afternoon classes, which begin at 12:30. Afternoon children who wish lunch will come at 11:30. Afternoon classes will follow a program similar (continued inside)

to morning until 3:00, which is going home time for all classes.

Once every two weeks on Friday evening children are invited to come at 5:00 P.M. for picnic dinner, campfire fun, and overnight campout. They depart the following morning at 8:30 A.M., after a sizzling campfire breakfast.

Tuition for each week is payable in advance, and the first week's payment is due upon enrollment, and is not returnable. You are encouraged to register early, to assure your child's place in class.
